Element Achromatic RCA Analogue Interconnect Cable

The Element features Atlas' 'achromatic' non-magnetic RCA plug – it's a low-mass, solder-free connector, cold-welded to create a coherent, uncompromised signal path.

This cable is visually pleasant, thanks to its pearlescent finish, and, on test, we said: "It remains consistent in its ability to keep a soundstage tidy, keep the frequency range smoothly integrated and ensure rhythms and tempos stay on the front foot."

We also felt that "There's sufficient detail – of texture and timbre, as well as of depth and intensity – to make the Atlas a completely convincing listen."

Arran Ultra L RCA Grun Interconnect Cables

These cables have 6N purity (99.9999%) OCC copper conductors and a microporous PTFE dielectric, meaning the insulation is wrapped rather than extruded, allowing some air around the conductor. It also has four cores in two twisted pairs and two drain wires that spiral at 180° to one another beneath the screen, to keep RFI at bay.

What we particularly liked about them is that "they deliver mountains of detail in a warm, grain-free fashion."

Our reviewer said: "If you want to get a better idea of just how much musical detail your equipment can resolve, I suggest you try them. Be warned, however, there may be no going back."
